Now the Philistines gathered together their armies to battle, a nd were gathered together at Shochoh, which belongeth to Judah, and pitched between Shochoh and Azekah, in Ephesdammim. And Sa ul and the men of Israel were gathered together, and pitched by the valley of Elah, and set the battle in array against the Ph ilistines. And the Philistines stood on a mountain on the one s ide, and Israel stood on a mountain on the other side: and ther e was a valley between them. And there went out a champion out of the camp of the Philistines, named Goliath, of Gath, whose h eight was six cubits and a span. And he had an helmet of brass upon his head, and he was armed with a coat of mail; and the we ight of the coat was five thousand shekels of brass. And he had greaves of brass upon his legs, and a target of brass between his shoulders. And the staff of his spear was like a weaver's b eam; and his spear's head weighed six hundred shekels of iron: and one bearing a shield went before him. And he stood and crie d unto the armies of Israel, and said unto them, Why are ye com e out to set your battle in array? am not I a Philistine, and y e servants to Saul? choose you a man for you, and let him come down to me. If he be able to fight with me, and to kill me, the n will we be your servants: but if I prevail against him, and k ill him, then shall ye be our servants, and serve us. And the P hilistine said, I defy the armies of Israel this day; give me a man, that we may fight together. When Saul and all Israel hear d those words of the Philistine, they were dismayed, and greatl y afraid. ¶Now David was the son of that Ephrathite of Bethlehe mjudah, whose name was Jesse; and he had eight sons: and the ma n went among men for an old man in the days of Saul. And the th ree eldest sons of Jesse went and followed Saul to the battle: and the names of his three sons that went to the battle were El iab the firstborn, and next unto him Abinadab, and the third Sh ammah. And David was the youngest: and the three eldest followe d Saul. But David went and returned from Saul to feed his fathe r's sheep at Bethlehem. And the Philistine drew near morning an d evening, and presented himself forty days. And Jesse said unt o David his son, Take now for thy brethren an ephah of this par ched corn, and these ten loaves, and run to the camp to thy bre thren; And carry these ten cheeses unto the captain of their th ousand, and look how thy brethren fare, and take their pledge. Now Saul, and they, and all the men of Israel, were in the vall ey of Elah, fighting with the Philistines. And David rose up ea rly in the morning, and left the sheep with a keeper, and took, and went, as Jesse had commanded him; and he came to the trenc h, as the host was going forth to the fight, and shouted for th e battle. For Israel and the Philistines had put the battle in array, army against army. And David left his carriage in the ha nd of the keeper of the carriage, and ran into the army, and ca me and saluted his brethren. And as he talked with them, behold

, there came up the champion, the Philistine of Gath, Goliath b y name, out of the armies of the Philistines, and spake accordi ng to the same words: and David heard them. And all the men of Israel, when they saw the man, fled from him, and were sore afr aid. And the men of Israel said, Have ye seen this man that is come up? surely to defy Israel is he come up: and it shall be, that the man who killeth him, the king will enrich him with gre at riches, and will give him his daughter, and make his father' s house free in Israel. And David spake to the men that stood b y him, saying, What shall be done to the man that killeth this Philistine, and taketh away the reproach from Israel? for who i s this uncircumcised Philistine, that he should defy the armies of the living God? And the people answered him after this mann er, saying, So shall it be done to the man that killeth him. An d Eliab his eldest brother heard when he spake unto the men; an d Eliab's anger was kindled against David, and he said, Why cam est thou down hither? and with whom hast thou left those few sh eep in the wilderness? I know thy pride, and the naughtiness of thine heart; for thou art come down that thou mightest see the battle. And David said, What have I now done? Is there not a c ause? And he turned from him toward another, and spake after th e same manner: and the people answered him again after the form er manner. ¶And when the words were heard which David spake, th ey rehearsed them before Saul: and he sent for him. And David s aid to Saul, Let no man's heart fail because of him; thy servan t will go and fight with this Philistine. And Saul said to Davi d, Thou art not able to go against this Philistine to fight wit h him: for thou art but a youth, and he a man of war from his y outh. And David said unto Saul, Thy servant kept his father's s heep, and there came a lion, and a bear, and took a lamb out of the flock: And I went out after him, and smote him, and delive red it out of his mouth: and when he arose against me, I caught him by his beard, and smote him, and slew him. Thy servant sle w both the lion and the bear: and this uncircumcised Philistine shall be as one of them, seeing he hath defied the armies of t he living God. David said moreover, The LORD that delivered me out of the paw of the lion, and out of the paw of the bear, he will deliver me out of the hand of this Philistine. And Saul sa id unto David, Go, and the LORD be with thee. And Saul armed Da vid with his armour, and he put an helmet of brass upon his hea d; also he armed him with a coat of mail. And David girded his sword upon his armour, and he assayed to go; for he had not pro ved it. And David said unto Saul, I cannot go with these; for I have not proved them. And David put them off him. ¶And he took his staff in his hand, and chose him five smooth stones out of the brook, and put them in a shepherd's bag which he had, even in a scrip; and his sling was in his hand: and he drew near to the Philistine. And the Philistine came on and drew near unto David; and the man that bare the shield went before him. And wh en the Philistine looked about, and saw David, he disdained him : for he was but a youth, and ruddy, and of a fair countenance. And the Philistine said unto David, Am I a dog, that thou come

st to me with staves? And the Philistine cursed David by his go ds. And the Philistine said to David, Come to me, and I will gi ve thy flesh unto the fowls of the air, and to the beasts of th e field. Then said David to the Philistine, Thou comest to me w ith a sword, and with a spear, and with a shield: but I come to thee in the name of the LORD of hosts, the God of the armies o f Israel, whom thou hast defied. This day will the LORD deliver thee into mine hand; and I will smite thee, and take thine hea d from thee; and I will give the carcases of the host of the Ph ilistines this day unto the fowls of the air, and to the wild b easts of the earth; that all the earth may know that there is a God in Israel. And all this assembly shall know that the LORD saveth not with sword and spear: for the battle is the LORD'S, and he will give you into our hands. ¶And it came to pass, when the Philistine arose, and came and drew nigh to meet David, th at David hasted, and ran toward the army to meet the Philistine . And David put his hand in his bag, and took thence a stone, a nd slang it, and smote the Philistine in his forehead, that the stone sunk into his forehead; and he fell upon his face to the earth. So David prevailed over the Philistine with a sling and with a stone, and smote the Philistine, and slew him; but ther e was no sword in the hand of David. Therefore David ran, and s tood upon the Philistine, and took his sword, and drew it out o f the sheath thereof, and slew him, and cut off his head therew ith. And when the Philistines saw their champion was dead, they fled. And the men of Israel and of Judah arose, and shouted, a nd pursued the Philistines, until thou come to the valley, and to the gates of Ekron. And the wounded of the Philistines fell down by the way to Shaaraim, even unto Gath, and unto Ekron. An d the children of Israel returned from chasing after the Philis tines, and they spoiled their tents. And David took the head of the Philistine, and brought it to Jerusalem; but he put his ar mour in his tent. And when Saul saw David go forth against the Philistine, he said unto Abner, the captain of the host, Abner, whose son is this youth? And Abner said, As thy soul liveth, O king, I cannot tell. And the king said, Enquire thou whose son the stripling is. And as David returned from the slaughter of the Philistine, Abner took him, and brought him before Saul wit h the head of the Philistine in his hand. And Saul said to him, Whose son art thou, thou young man? And David answered, I am t he son of thy servant Jesse the Bethlehemite.
